Creativision Tennis

With Tennis by Creativision you can enjoy the challenge and excitement of tennis on your home TV.

START-UP

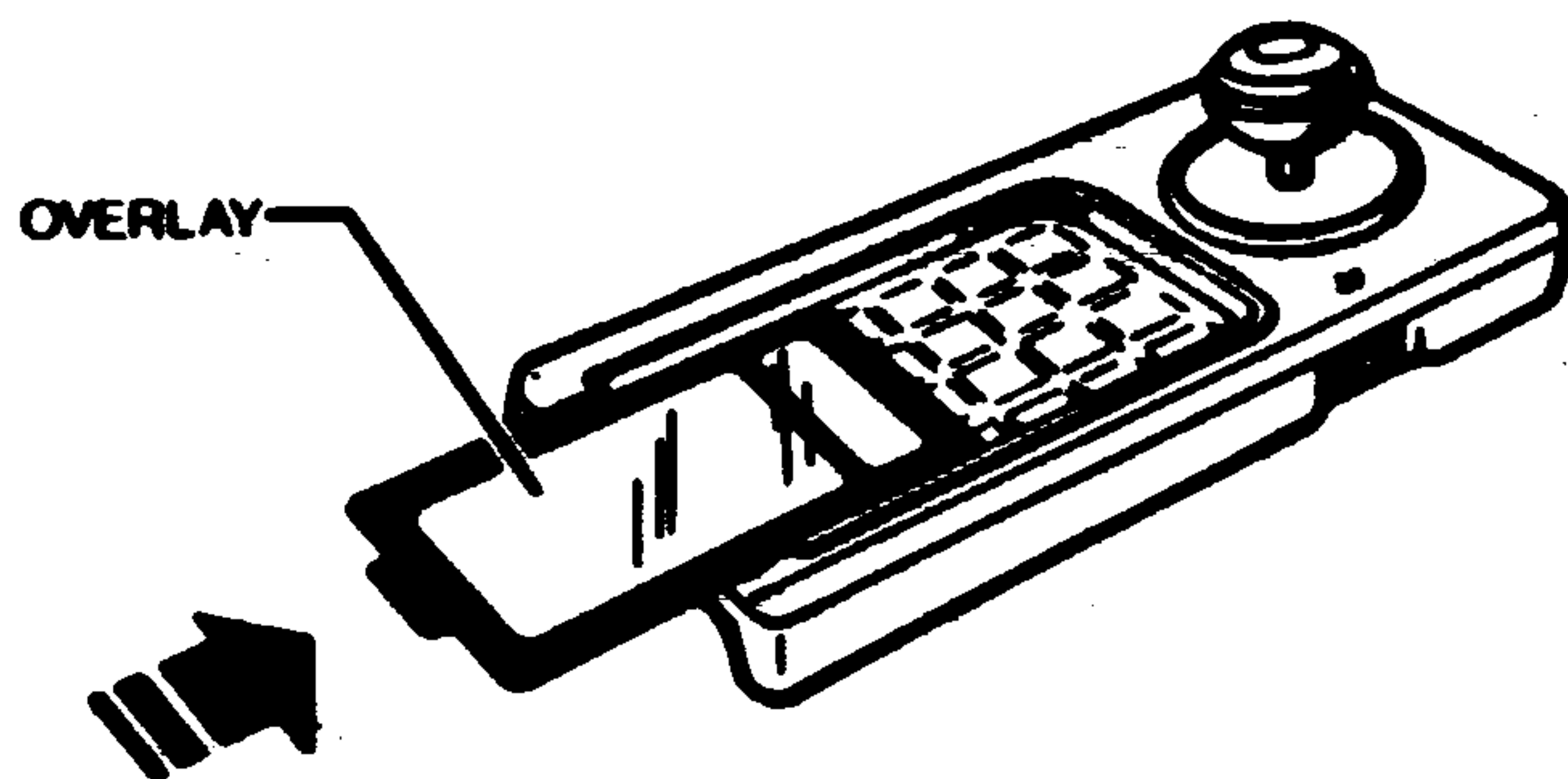
Check the following:

1. The main unit antenna cable is connected to the TV set.
2. The power cord is plugged in.
3. TV set is plugged in and adjusted.
4. Make sure that the Power Switch of the main unit is OFF.
5. Insert the Tennis cartridge in the slot.

Now turn on the power switch and tune the TV. A demonstration of Tennis will be shown on the TV.

START GAME

Get the two Tennis overlays in the cartridge with this booklet. Insert ~~them into each hand-control as shown:~~



To start, press the RESET button on the main unit.

Now you can select the game by pressing the "Select" game button. Then start the game by pressing the "Start" button. The two buttons are on the "Hand-control". "

GAME VARIATION

There are 16 games in the cartridge, from 1 to 16. Press the game button will advance the game number.

For ONE PLAYER games, you play against the Creativision computer. For TWO LAYER games, you play against your friend. Note that in ONE PLAYER games, 1 are the red player, the computer is the blue player.

TO SERVE

Push the SERVE button. The SERVE button is used for serving only. After serving, players will swing automatically if they are in position to return a shot.

SCORING

Scoring is the same as in real tennis, 15-30-40, "deuce" at 40-all, and "ad in" or "ad out" following "deuce". The first player to win at least 6 games and be ahead by two games wins the set. If players tie in games at 6-6, a tie-break system is operated. The first player to score 7 points with a 2-point lead is the winner. If the score reaches 6-all the game continues until one play leads by 2 points.

PLACING YOUR SHOTS

Just as in real tennis, you can aim and 'Place' the ball depending on how you hit it. The angle of your shot is controlled by where you hit the ball on your racket. The closer you hit the ball to the edge of the racket, the sharper will be the angle of the shot.
